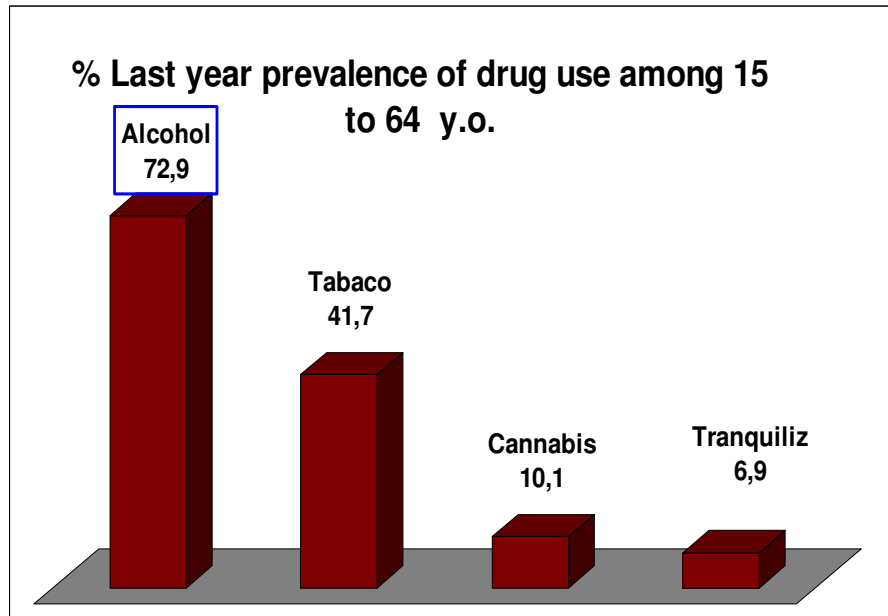

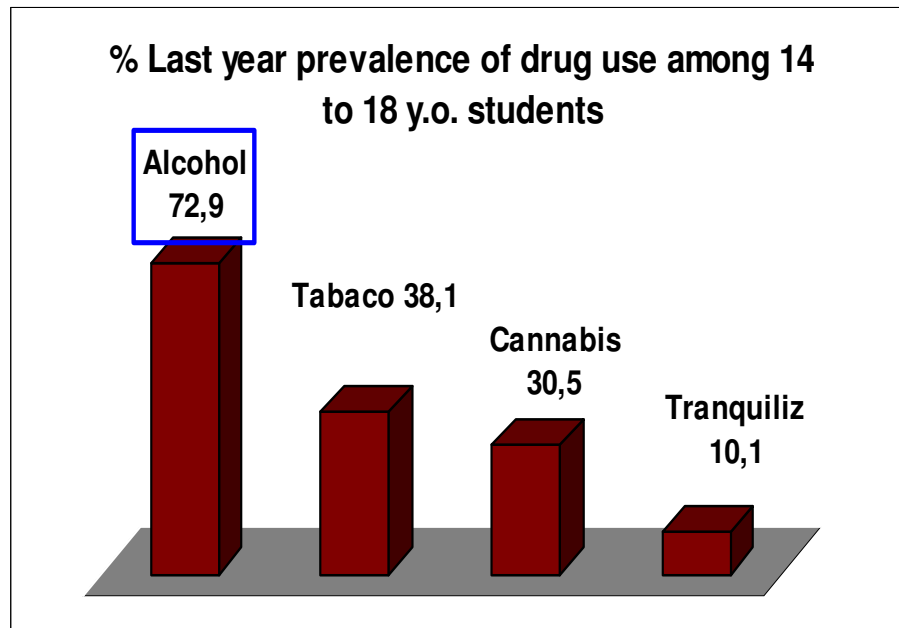

15-64 y.o. GENERAL POPULATION



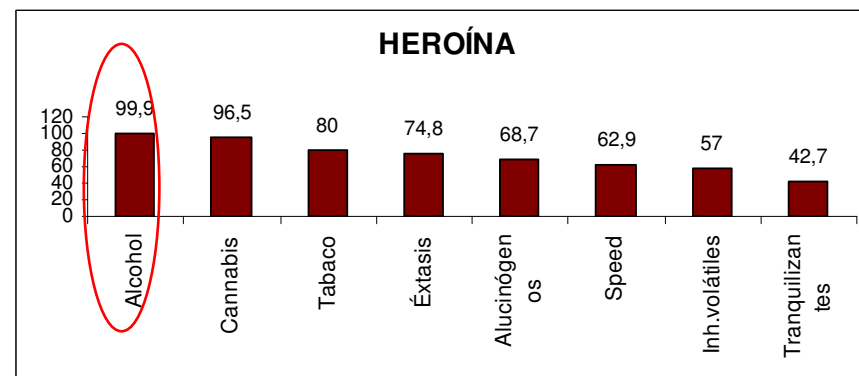
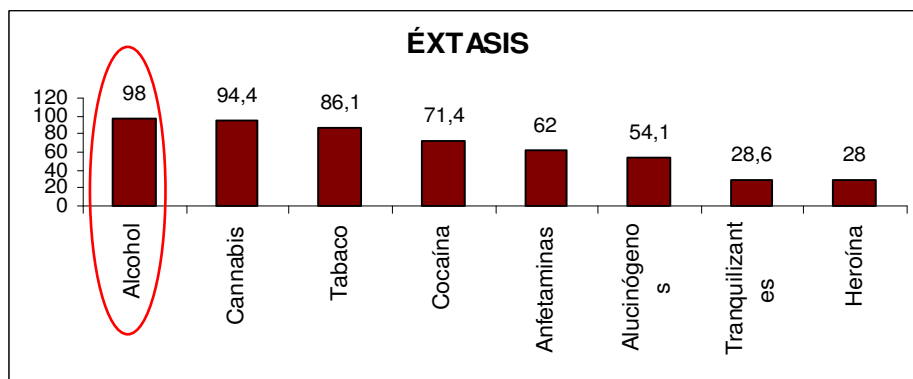
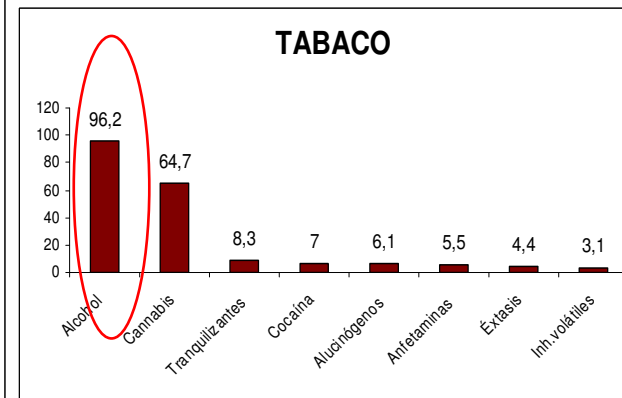
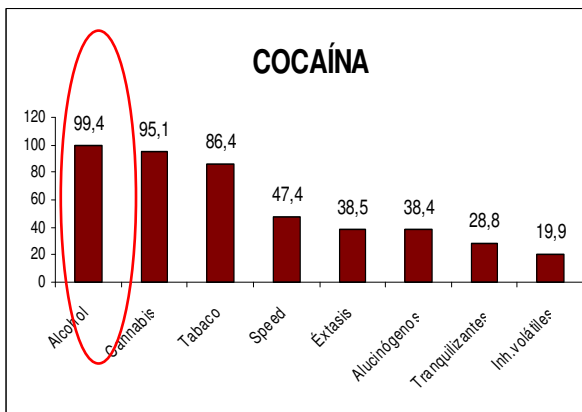
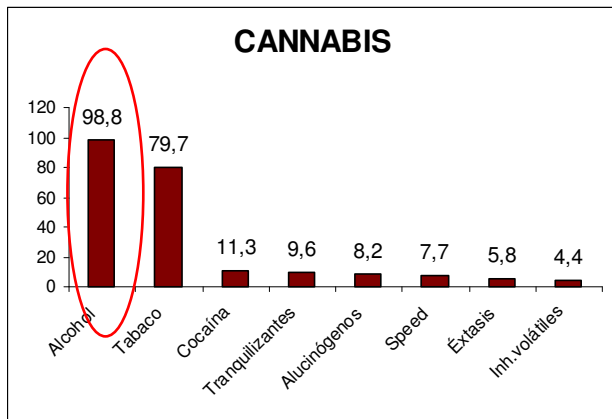

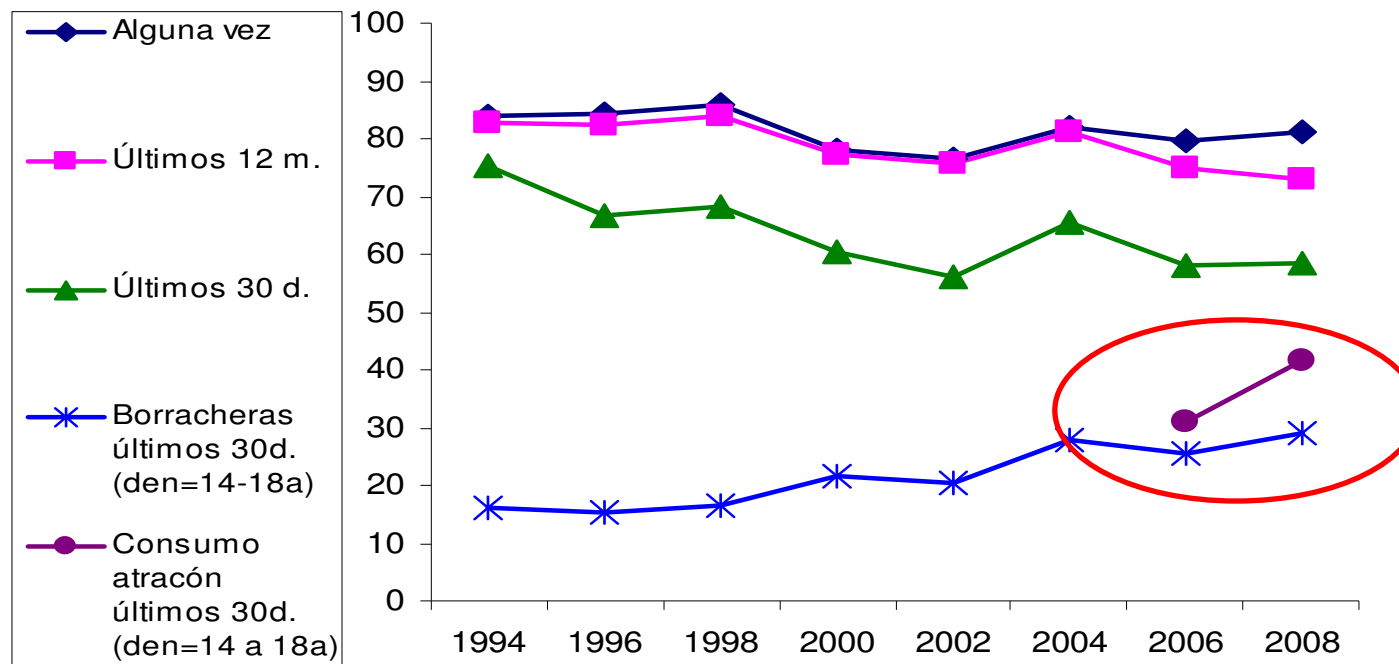

- Intoxications (F>M) and *binge drinking* 

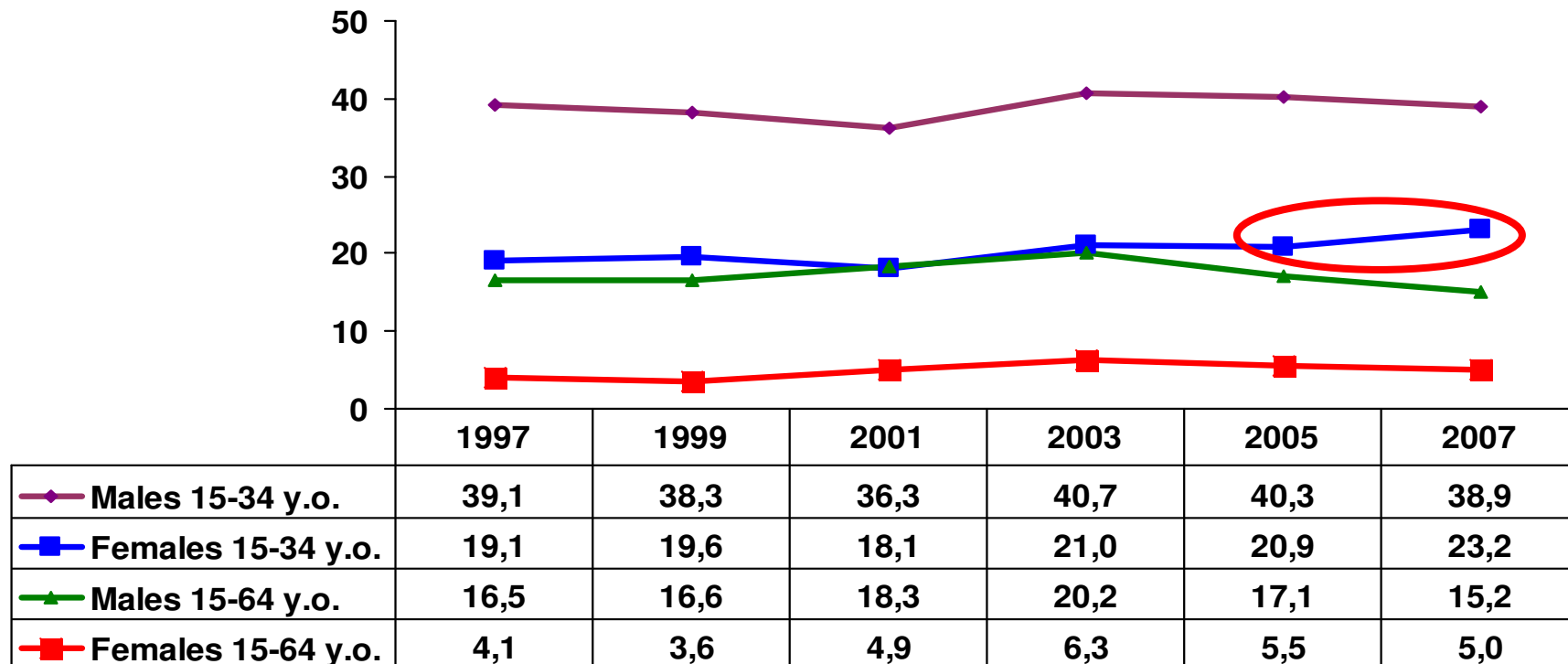

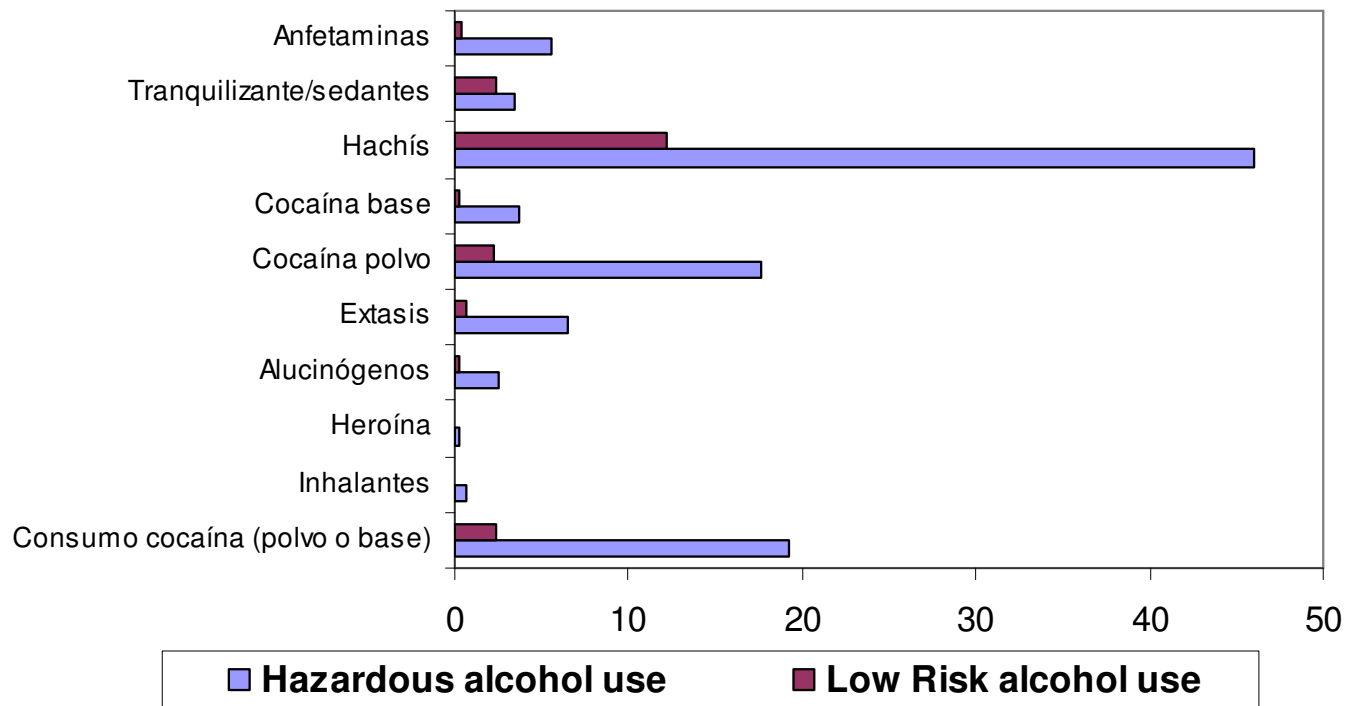

Illegal drug use among those meeting HAZARDOUS ALCOHOL USE CRITERIA* in comparison with low risk alcohol users



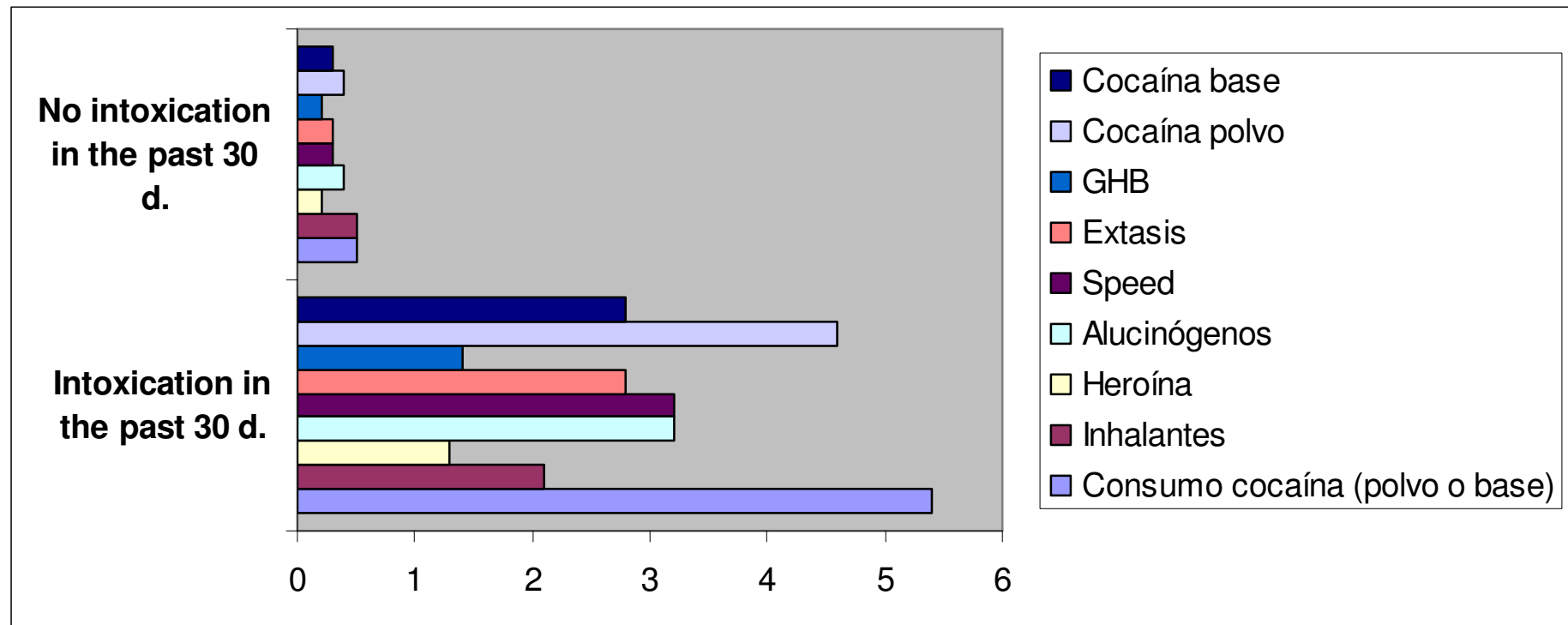
* Hazardous alcohol use (Anderson & Baumberg): Level II: over 40-60 g/d alcohol (males) or 20-40 g alcohol /day (females).

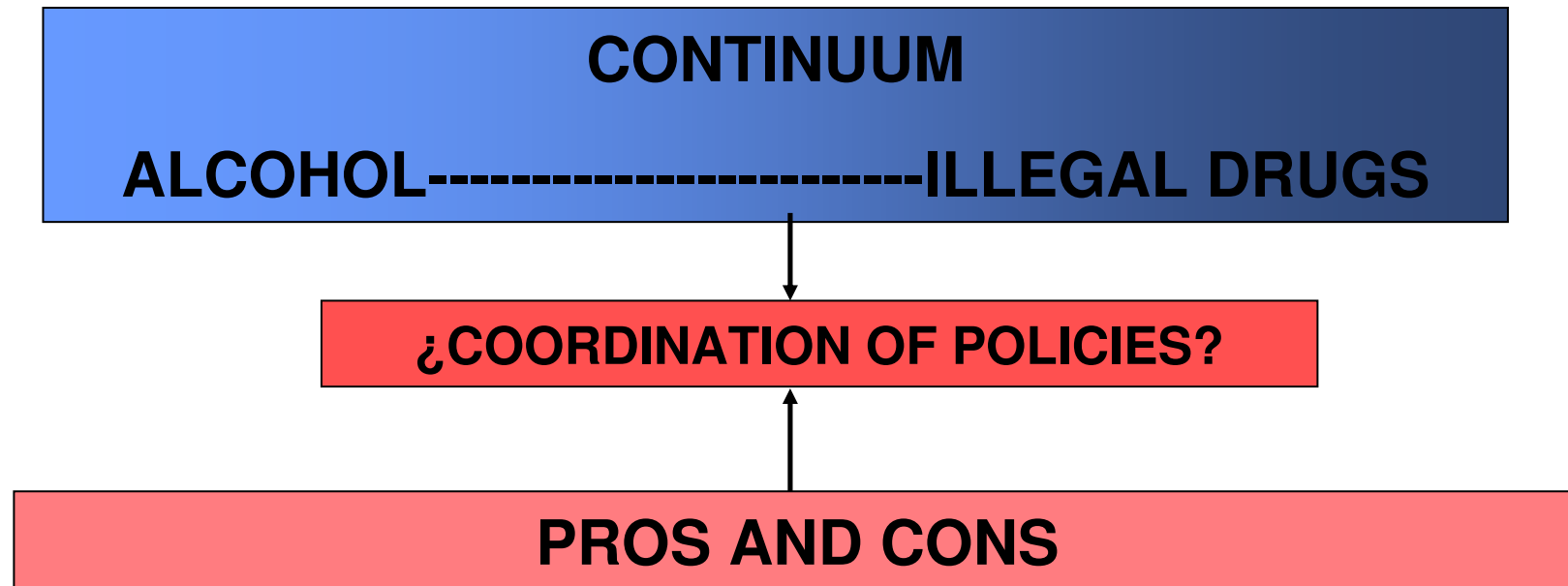
Last 30 days prevalence of illegal drug use among those who got drunk in comparison with those who did not

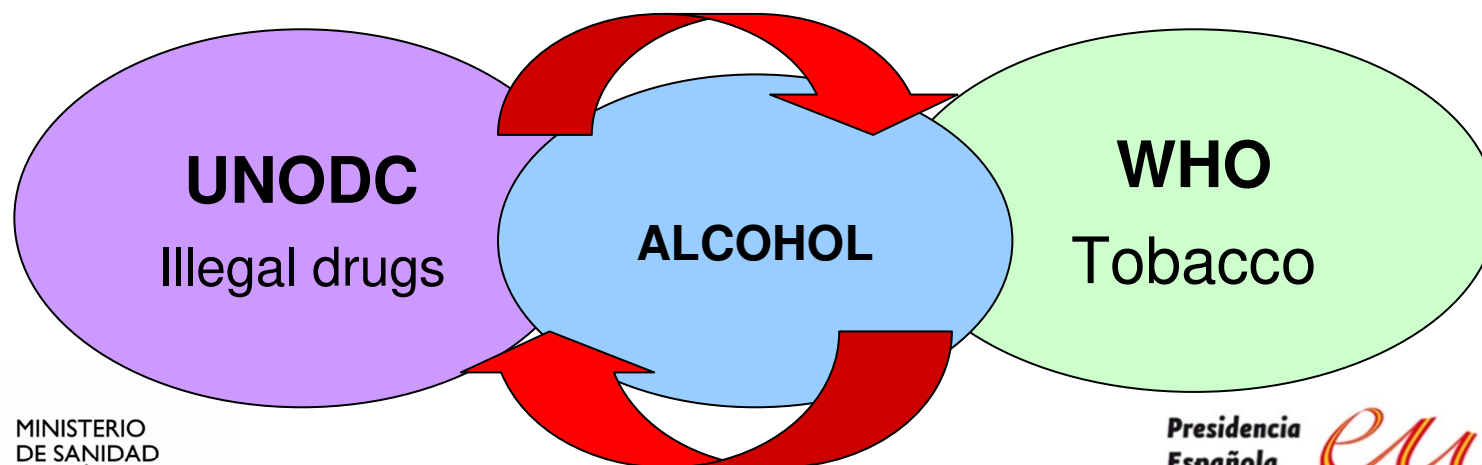

Action Plan on Alcohol 2010-2014

- **Target population**: Minors & Pregnant women
- **Objectives**:
 1. Delay age of drinking onset
 2. Reduce alcohol consumption
 3. Reduce alcohol-related harm
- **No new regulation**
- **Stick to evidence-based interventions**
- **Tailor-made to suit national scenario**
- **In tune with EU & WHO**

Action Plan on Alcohol 2010-2014

Main strategic areas:

1. Increasing awareness → society
2. Preventive school and family programs
3. Early detection and brief intervention
4. Community action
5. Training for professionals
6. Research
7. Coordination with stakeholders
